



How to Have an Awesome Interview



What to Wear

You're going for a job interview so remember that you want to present yourself at your best! Be sure to be thoughtful and put together an outfit that shows you care about the interview you're about to have.

What to Say

When being interviewed, always look the person in the eye and answer their questions in detail. The more upbeat and personable you are, the better chance you have of getting the job.

Talking About Money

The salary range is in the job description you applied to. Don't try to negotiate a higher rate. This throws families off. If salary negotiations come up, you can always defer to us and we will be happy to speak to the family on your behalf.

The Wrap Up

Mention that the MyNanny team will be in touch with them to follow up. If they want you to come back for a trial day or another interview, you can coordinate that directly with them (or we can help schedule that). Always remember to shake their hand and look them directly the eye and thank them for their time.

Late & Cancellation Policy

Always show up to the location of your interview early even if you have to wait around the area until your scheduled time. Most families won't hire you even if you're a few minutes late. It communicates that you'll be late when you are in charge of their kids. If you need to cancel, please do so 24 hours in advance. If you cancel the day of (unless it's a true emergency) or don't show up to the interview, your profile will be taken off our site. If you know you'll be late and it's a legitimate excuse, let the person know who set up your interview right away.

What to Bring

Always bring a professional looking resume with you that has all your job experience, education, and childcare experience. This makes a big impact on families and looks super professional.

What to Ask

When it's time for you to ask questions, you need to be super interested in their kids. Ask about their school, their interests, and how you can be a good influence on their kids.

How'd We Meet?

Some families might ask where we found you (it doesn't happen very often). However, we like to keep that information confidential (our recruiting is a part of our "secret sauce"). If they ask, please just say that you found our site online and signed up. If you have any questions about that, you can email our team.

Commitment

It's best not to mention that you are willing to quit your current job to work for their family. It communicates that you would be willing to quit their job too if another opportunity came along. If you have current employment, you can tell them that you have been looking to transition to another position and you can list your reasons. Always communicate that you are willing to commit to their family for as long as they need you (or as long as was specified in the job post). Most of our families are looking for at least a year of commitment.
